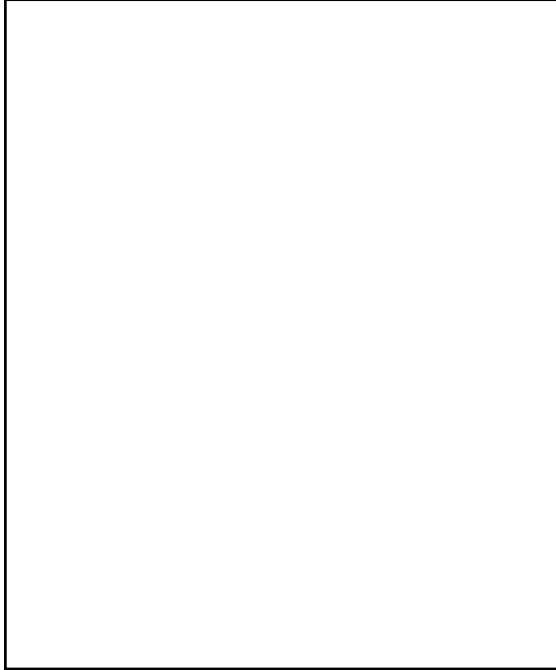

LAST YEAR'S CHAMPION



Justin Rose

Top-ranked player Justin Rose of England had never missed the cut at Colonial in four previous appearances, so having missed the event for several years since did nothing to dampen his expectations for Fort Worth in 2018. The 2016 Olympic Gold Medalist settled in with an opening 66, and then followed that with an impressive 64 in round two.

The 10-under score gave him the 36-hole lead, as he was playing Hogan-esque golf by hitting lots of fairways and greens. The 37-year-old Rose has built a reputation for winning on great courses, with prior victories at Muirfield Village, Merion, Royal Aberdeen and others. The Colonial challenge was right up his alley.

In round three, he quickly birdied the first three holes, separating himself from the stellar field. Reigning U.S. Open champion Brooks Koepka nipped at his heels nonetheless, lurking in second place.

Rose posted a 66 on Saturday, but knew that a four-shot lead gave his pursuers a green light for a go-for-broke Sunday. "You've got to continue to make birdies," he acknowledged. "It is a big lead, but it isn't big enough."

Koepka and Rose, paired together for the final round, and both came out swinging in the ideal scoring conditions. Both birdied the first two holes, then Rose flinched slightly with a bogey on #3. A 23-foot birdie putt on the difficult fifth hole, however, re-staked his position, and Rose turned on the gas by birdieing three of the next four holes for a front nine 30.

Koepka got no closer than three shots, and the unflappable Rose finished off his stellar 64 to miss the tournament record by just one stroke. It was his ninth PGA Tour win, and second of the season. He has just as many international wins. Rose is the second European to win at Colonial, joining Sergio Garcia.

"I'm really, really proud of this one," said Rose, who climbed from fifth in the World Rankings to third. "This is a special victory for me. Winning here at this venue means so much. I picked up the trophy and the first thing I saw was Ben Hogan's name - twice. I'm very proud of the places I've been able to win. I've been inspired by some of these great venues."

Rose continued his great play through the summer, capping the year as the PGA Tour's FedExCup champion and reaching the #1 World Ranking spot. He then helped his European squad to victory in the Ryder Cup.

Rose and wife Kate live in Orlando with their two children. From there they run the Kate & Justin Rose Foundation, benefitting area youth through a variety of programs, initiatives and events.

Justin Rose

Perfect scoring conditions greeted a stellar field, as light breezes led to a birdie-fest. Half the field broke par in the first round, though only 35 beat par in round two. 2016 Olympic Gold Medal Winner Justin Rose jumped out to the 36-hole lead at 10 under par, with a second-round 64.

On Saturday, the Englishman birdied his first three holes to create separation from the field. Rose's solid 66 staked him to a four-shot lead going into Sunday.

The big lead made it possible for players who were chasing to play free and aggressive, and several made charges, as Brooks Koepka and Emiliano Grillo posted 63 and 64, respectively, on Sunday. However, the steely Rose kept his foot on the gas and matched them with eight birdies of his own, and his impressive 64 gave him the three-shot victory, just one stroke shy of the tournament record.

HIGHLIGHTS

Windy conditions throughout the week kept scores high and the players bunched up. Two Spaniards made early splashes - rookie Jon Rahm and reigning Masters champ Sergio Garcia, the 2001 Colonial winner.

But it was six-year Tour veteran Kevin Kisner who seized a share of the 36-hole lead following a near record high cut of 4-over-par... the highest in 18 years at Colonial.

Webb Simpson grabbed the 54-hole lead, and then battled it out on Sunday with Kisner, Rahm and surging defending champion Jordan Spieth.

Simpson kept the lead through the front nine, but Kisner staged a 3-birdie run at holes 10-12 to surge into the top spot. His 4-under 66 held up for a one shot victory and his second PGA Tour win.
