Things to Know

- Following a career-low 8-under 62, PGA TOUR Rookie Harry Hall holds the first-round lead at the Charles Schwab Challenge by three strokes over Harris English; equals largest 18-hole lead of the season
- Hall holds the lead for the first time after any round in his 26th PGA TOUR start
- Defending champion Sam Burns opens with a 3-under 67 in bid to join Ben Hogan as players to successfully defend the tournament's title
- Playing alongside Burns, World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler posts a 3-under 67
- Jordan Spieth opens with an over-par round (72) for the first time in 11 starts at the event
- Sponsor Exemption Michael Block cards an 11-over 81

- Following a career-low 8-under 62, holds the first-round lead at the Charles Schwab Challenge; previous-low round was 64, set three times and most recently in round two of the 2023 Puerto Rico Open
- Marks his first time holding the lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Equals largest 18-hole lead of the season (3 strokes; Carson Young/Puerto Rico Open, S.Y. Noh/AT&T Byron Nelson)
- Becomes the first player to open with a 62 or better in Charles Schwab Challenge debut; previous-best opening round in a debut at this event is 63 (Anthony Kim/2007, Blake Adams/2010)
- The last player to win the Charles Schwab Challenge in debut appearance: Sergio Garcia (2001)
- Round included a career-high eight birdies and career-best 22 putts
- Best finish in 25 TOUR starts is T7 at the 2023 Puerto Rico Open

Additional Player Notes

- Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Harris English** posts 5-under 65, equaling his best start in eight starts at the event (65/2012); has two top-five finishes at Colonial Country Club (2nd/2016, T5/2012)
- World No. 1 and 2022 Charles Schwab Challenge runner-up **Scottie Scheffler** posts a 3-under 67 in his fourth start at the event
- Defending Charles Schwab Challenge champion **Sam Burns** is T7 following a 3-under 67; Ben Hogan (1946-47, 1952-53) is the only player to win the event in back-to-back years
- **Jordan Spieth** (+2/T82), who has nine top-15 finishes at the event, opens with an over-par score (72) for the first time in 11 starts at the Charles Schwab Challenge
- Lee Hodges (-1/T33) holes out for eagle from 96 yards on the par-4 ninth hole, becoming the seventh player to eagle the hole since 1983; played today with Beau Hossler, who was the most recent player to eagle No. 9 at Colonial Country Club (R1/2022)
- Coming off a T15 at last week's PGA Championship, PGA of America Professional Michael Block (120th) posts an 11-over 81
